

Chippenham and District Wheelers – Time Trial Report 2018

As I write this my 7th time trial report for the club I realise once again I have failed to keep all the comments and material I promise myself to make it easier. It also means that I have been doing this job for 7 years, not long compared to some club members duties but it may be that a younger more dynamic Racing Secretary might like to step up soon? Note that the time trial reports are on the club website and you can see how people have progressed (or not) over the years by reviewing them.

The club series of time trials were completed without major incident and although numbers were lower than in recent years and Open Events were well supported. We of course benefitted from the exceptionally hot summer and in the main our events were all held in the dry, apart from an early season hiccup for the Hardriders, postponed due to snow. Again a number of club age group records were broken.

The riders and the club committee thank all who officiate at the open and evening events and the family members and riders who marshal at the various points on the course where this is needed. Without marshals we cannot race and although we have usually managed to be alright on the night, all riders should look to their conscience and marshal at least one event if not more. All those who have marshalled were recorded on the club website. We have also begun the process of bringing on new time keepers as Mike and Sheila Edwards have suggested it would be a good idea. Mike and Sheila have just formally announced their retirement from timekeeping and signing on and although we have thanked Mike and Sheila in the past for their unwavering support I know all riders would want to pass on their thanks for their support and turning out in all weathers to allow us to race.

The Club Kilo was inevitably won by Simon Kay as the first event of the year.

The “medium” gear event is our first time trial of the season and was won by Mike Cox.

In 2018 we had 220 entries in the club evening events (versus 345 in 2017, versus 380 in 2016) and the Jack Nunn drew 130 entries (compared with 195 in 2017, 150 in 2016) with 29 club members riding across the 12 events (compared with 43 in 2017, 31 in 2016). It is not clear why numbers were lower this year, given the good weather. For those who took part there was good competition across the series. Sue Crane had another great season winning the Jack Nunn again and again being the most improved rider. Simon Cox again won the Jack Nunn on speed with an average time on his 6 best events of 23:46 against Paul Winchcombe’s 24:41 (next fastest).

Open Time Trial Events

The Club ran 4 Open Events this year and all were well supported, in particular the new course on the Spine Road which got good feedback despite the state of the road. Once again, SAS entries for the 3-Up formed the backbone of the event. The season started with the early season WTTA Hardriders event on U601 run by Paul Freegard – or it should have done but it got snowed off and delayed till later in the year. The Open 10 run by Paul Winchcombe ran this year on a new course – U41. The Open 25 was due to be run again by Paul Winchcombe on U86/25, but unfortunately U86 suffered a lot from BT cable laying and the event had to be cancelled, with no viable alternative dates. Nick Ferris was the Secretary for the traditional Hill Climb up Bowden Hill for which this year it poured with rain leading to comments about when did we last have a dry hill climb (answer 4 years ago) and the spectators stayed away, unlike the contestants. Andy Cook ran the end of season 3-Up for the 37th consecutive year (although it was actually Jacqui running the HQ on the day). We moved courses to U86 and ran one lap at 20 miles as U57 is now out of action with new traffic lights courtesy of Devizes town council. U86 worked better as a 3 Up course than expected and with the farmer's field next to the Village Hall we were not short of space. Of course the day before the event we discovered another set of unexpected road works but decided to go ahead with the event and although some teams had to wait at the traffic lights everybody thought it was the right decision. Wait, I hear you think out loud – it says we ran 4 events but one was cancelled. Well that is because Emma Angove ran a 50 mile TT for the club on U86/50 in place of Bristol South. Our success in running this event and some of the other events on U86 course were in large part down to her hard work and liaison with the road work teams.

The event organisers of all Club Open Events would like to thank all the marshals, tea ladies/men, cake makers, pushers off, result board producers and last but not least timekeepers. Once again, without your help these events would not take place. If any readers are not sure what all these jobs entail, please volunteer for the next Club event and we would be delighted to show you!

According to the CTT website Chippenham Wheelers rode 104 (versus 166 in 2017) times across the season with 18 riders (down from last years 37 which is a massive fall in numbers). Perhaps not surprisingly Paul Winchcombe led the way with 28 individual rides across the season. Kevin Thomas deserves a mention with 9 entries into Hill Climbs, including the National Championship where he was a very creditable 38th in a full field.

This year the CTT ran their new points ranking system based on points for places in events with some calculation also for the size of field. It is worth noting this competition is based on results in 12 events, so there is an element of being in it to win it (OK not win but to rise up the rankings). In the early season Paul Winchcombe was in the top 10 but fell away by the end of the season to be 439th (1246.383 points) and Kevin Thomas was the next Chippenham Wheeler at 606th (1105.51 points). If Kevin had entered 3 more hill climbs he would have beaten Paul. Other placings were:

All other Chippenham riders only had one event.

This year Paul Winchcombe was 50th in the 3 distance BBAR (50, 100 and 12 hr) out of 95 qualifying riders. Simon Cox was 65th (which is the same placing he had in 2017 – I had to check several times as the coincidence seemed too much) in the 2 distance BBAR (50 and/or 100 miles and/or 12 hr) out of 240 qualifying riders. Jamie Richardson-Paige was the only club rider to compete in a 24 Hr this year and he placed 31st (out of 50 finishers) with a distance of 360.26 miles.

Audaxes

Although Audaxes are not races (apparently if you are too fast you get disqualified or at least have to wait before entering the control) I thought it worth recording the information I have been provided with. Information is all on the Audax UK website in the club points table. Link for Chippenham Wheelers points table is here:

(For time trailers note that the distances are in kilometres and not miles, very confusing.)

Under AUK rules only Audax rides over 200km distance qualify for points. Audax events like the Flapjack 100km earn "distance" but not points.

To see how many km each person has ridden click on their name. Our club handbook rules also takes into account distance ridden in our club's audax series. So the winner of this year's Audax Shield is Sheni Jiwa who rode 5550km under AUK rules plus another 125km in our club series, for the season distance of 5,675 km

Rob Duncumb was next in the AUK league with 4327km.

It was a good year for our club in the AUK club championship, thanks largely to the efforts of Sheni Jiwa, Rob Duncumb, James Bradbury and Kate Churchill. Chippenham Wheelers ranked 23rd out of

364 clubs, right on the heels of the specialist Audax clubs. There's a link here if you are interested <http://www.aukweb.net/results/archive/2018/clubs/>

Special mention should go to James Bradbury, one of only 56 people to successfully complete the Mille Cymru, over 1000km of riding all the major climbs of Wales, 16000 metres of climbing, in under 75 hours. Also Rob Duncumb for completing his first Super Randonneur series (I'll bet Shen was getting worried as the kilometres racked up.).
