#### Chippenham and District Wheelers – Time Trial Report 2023

We had a steady but small participation in time trials this year, with events being run as usual on Wednesday evenings. Roadworks disrupted our use of the usual course in Sutton Benger but we are well provided with alternative routes and managed to complete the Jack Nunn series. We lost some events to weather where riders voted with their feet and the Nixon Cup (50 mile time trial) had to be raced in an Open Event as both our course options were out of action.

Our club Open Events were as usual very well run and had enough entries from across the District to justify running them. The events once again broke even.

The new Bring A Friend Two Up was a nice addition to the variety of our evening time trials. We also had a new hilly course which starts in Sodom Lane which is both technical and has one sharp climb up Callow Hill before turning for Brinkworth and descending into Little Somerford.

Zwift Racing ran until early March as team time trials and has restarted now that the season is over. The difference in numbers (power) is interesting and the performance (positions) matches the real world. What it does encourage is team work as the stronger riders come back to draft those getting left behind back to the pack.

As always my thanks to the organisers and those that turn out to support the events we run. We remain dependent on Sue Andrews and if anyone would like to learn to become a time keeper it would be most helpful. The Racing Secretary does stand in for Sue when she is away but then loses out on a race himself, which at times is helpful in providing a rest but doesn't help his aging legs as training is lost.

The weekly write up of club events has continued to be conducted through Facebook.

The trophy night was again held in the Chippenham Sports and Social Club which went well and the presentations were conducted efficiently. It was very nice to be able to award Theo Anderson his trophy haul. The 2022 prize lists and report are on the website.

The club website has had a facelift for time trials and now all courses are available via <u>tabbed pages</u> as well as the usual document of all courses. Meeting points have been included in What3Words format and some have been changed to better suit the course start point.

For 2024 the club evening event calendar has been reviewed and is now laid out more logically, with Jack Nunn events 2 weeks in a row, interspersed with other events; the Nixon Cup 50 moved closer to the Longest Day as it had drifted away from that date. A new 5 mile Come and Try It (CATI) course has been designed after the enthusiasm shown by the Saturday riders at the Open Hill Climb.

Worthy of note were our 3 riders in the National Road Bike Time Trial Championship held on a variant of U601B – U604. David English (who raced 3 times that weekend), Simon Cox and Jo Meier (in her first ever open time trial event). Also we had a intrepid 4 Up team at the DBMax event at Thruxton with David English, James Eccleston and Mike Griffin towing Paul Winchcombe round before casting him loose on the last lap.

#### **Open Event Reports**

#### U601

David English ran his first Open Event this year, supported by Paul Freegard and it went very well, despite having to be run on shortened course due to roadworks. There were 32 starters out of the 38 entries. Theo Anderson placed first of the club riders in a time of 34:16, with Matt Chapple second club rider in a time of 35:09.

#### U41

We had a good field of entries for the first running of U41 on 13 May this year with 51 starters. Once again we had dry roads and the triathlon didn't appear to confuse the riders, although what the drivers made of the plethora of signs I don't know. .2 members of the club rode with David English turning in a 23:56 and Peter Iffland a 25:49. The first women home was Jessica Rhodes-Jones AeroCoach in a time of 22:54 (a new women's course record) and therefore the winner of the Sheila Wiseman Rose Bowl trophy.

#### U86/25

Event had to be cancelled due to roadworks on the course.

#### **UH80**

UH80 is a part of the WTTA Hillclimb series was held on 30 September, once again ably run by Ian Potts and Simon Cox, with support from the Church of St Anne's. The cake sales raised a good donation for the church. The event had 32 starters out of the 38 entries. 3 of the club rode with honours going to Andrew Lockwood in a time of 4:58:36. David English raced his first event of 3 that weekend and Paul Winchcombe was just pleased to be under 8 minutes again.

# U41

The final running of U41 for this year followed the Hill Climb and was on 1 October. After the recent ups and downs of the weather it was very nice to be greeted by a mild morning with dry roads, although of course many of the riders commented on the return headwind. With an early start on a Sunday morning the traffic counts were as low as hoped, so in future events on U41 will probably run on Sundays to avoid the inevitable traffic build up for later starters by the Cotswold Water Park.

There were 25 starters and 8 DNS. Only David English from the club rode in is second event of the weekend coming 5th in the TT category in a time of 23:40. Paul Winchcombe picked up the running of the event and sadly was not able to race. Of interest on the day were the two trikes being ridden and as the first trikes to race the course they set men's and women's course records.

## **Open Time Trial Standings**

According to the CTT website Chippenham Wheelers entered 94 times across the season with 13 riders. Paul Winchcombe managing to enter 30 events (an increase on last year!), Peter Iffland rode in 19 again, Andrew Lockwood attacking the hill climbs rode in 11. Spindata's anomalous system in my opinion places Matt Chapple as 4th in the club on only 3 rides!

Spindata results system provided the CTT Ranking system and once again I am still not sure how it calculates it results. Its scoring is based on position in fields rather than time and also is not concerned about across season effort. Once again it puts Theo Anderson as first in the club, so once again congratulations to him for some excellent rides. The system does not show all riders as I am

aware of some riders who have raced but since they only have one event, they have not been scored, so it is much harder to do a full analysis of our riders.
