The Dome replacement project has taken some significant steps these past few months thanks to the project committee in place.

Plans have been drawn, governing bodies have been contacted and Sport England have visited the site and given their full support.

The next stages will be pre-planning and discussions with local and county councils before going to some already highlighted potential financial supports.

At present the new building will fill the space of the current dome including the overgrown boundary shrubbery where serial killers bury their victims and the pupils of the 2 secondary schools throw their cigarette butts.

It's a 2-storey building that will have its own entrance reception, changing facilities, multi-use rooms for classes and school use, dedicated space for a local boxing gym, and pull-out seating and a balcony for spectators.

The current Dome installation led by previous Chairman Tim Waycott and the then committee was erected in 2008 and has served more than its purpose. It has housed more ball sports than the Dallas Health studio over the years and is a permanent home for Chippenham Netball, Dodgeball, Vampire Tennis players and the mysterious sport of Badminton.

The new building will secure The Sports clubs position on the map and will be the envy of not only all other clubs in Wiltshire but the envy of sports clubs in the Southwest. With an improved floor, secure entrance, storage and actual hot water this long-awaited replacement will improve conditions for those currently using, those wanting to use and even attract some alternative sports such as Paddleboard, Handball, Parkour and Quidditch.
